

Classroom Behavior Plan

On the first few days of school, the students and I discuss our classroom rules and the behaviors needed for success throughout the school year. Our five classroom rules will be the basis from which they earn positive and negative consequences for their behavior. Classroom behavior will be monitored with a "color chart" in which students move clothespins when making exceptionally good choices (move up) or when needing redirection from the teacher (move down). Every student begins a new day on green! The meaning of each color is as follows:

Pink	Purple	Blue	Green	Yellow	Orange	Red
Awesome!	Great Job!	Good Day!	Ready to Learn!	Think About It!	Teacher's Choice	Parent Contact
Add a jewel to your clothespin!			Students begin here daily.	Warning	Removal from team if needed	Needs Improvement

Note: The earned color will be stamped in the agenda to inform you of your child's classroom behavior/academic efforts.

Students will NOT be stamped if the homework is not written in the agenda! 😊

Classroom Rules:



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1. Be gentle with your hands, body, and objects.
2. Be prepared to participate.
3. Be mindful of others trying to learn.
4. Be respectful with your words and actions.
5. Be aware of what is expected of you for each task.



Possible Positive Consequences:

- Success without a material reward
- Verbal or written praise
- Caught Being Good (Brownie Point) = This demonstrates team effort! Earned for the entire team for noticeable excellent behavior or for being ready to participate before being asked! A "brownie" is awarded to the team. Once the team earns 5 brownies, the team earns a reward!
- Cookie Compliment = This demonstrates class effort! Whenever the class receives a compliment, a "cookie" will be added to our Cookie Compliments board. Once the class earns 10 cookies, the class will receive a reward!
- Treasure Box = Stickers, edibles, certificates, coloring pages, etc.
- Moving up on the Behavior Chart/ Earning jewels for the clothespin (Once 5 jewels are earned, the clothespin is "retired" to the Hall of Fame and a new clothespin is put into use.)

Possible Negative Consequences:

- Verbal redirection or warning
- Loss of privileges (i.e. change seat location, time-out in another classroom, removal from an activity, etc.)
- A note or phone call home
- A visit to the principal/assistant principals
- Conference with the teacher
